Church History: Presbyterian Women

A “Woman’s Missionary Society” was started in 1903 and actively raised funds, mainly by some form of cooking, sent to national and foreign missions. They also sent supplies to the Freedman’s Board which promoted school for black children. Locally, women raised funds for the College of Idaho.

“The Loyal Sisters Bible Class” had a weekly average attendance of 77, meeting every Sunday morning. They also provided dinners and acted as a Ladies Aid Society.

Eventually the two mission groups joined into one.

The “Matron’s Guild”, around 1911, addressing itself to care of the newly built parsonage and needs within the community. They provided social opportunities for the women of the congregation with social meetings four times a year in the form of a sewing circle. Meals were made available to anyone in the community during the floods of the 40’s. Many community dinners and social events were planned to help bring the community together.

Today church women evolved into Women’s Association, now Presbyterian Women, still serving the church and the community. The annual rummage sale started in the 1930’s until 2018. Lion’s cooking committees have provided the Lions Club lunches for 63 years. Quilt raffles and many bazaars provided funds for our kids to attend Camp Sawtooth and maintenance needs of the church and Community House have received their financial help.

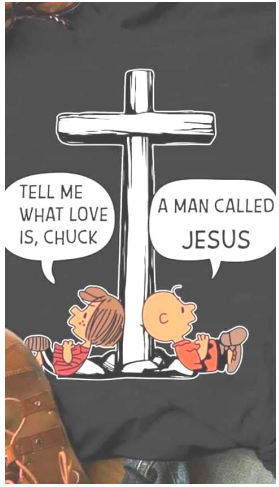

Good Friday?

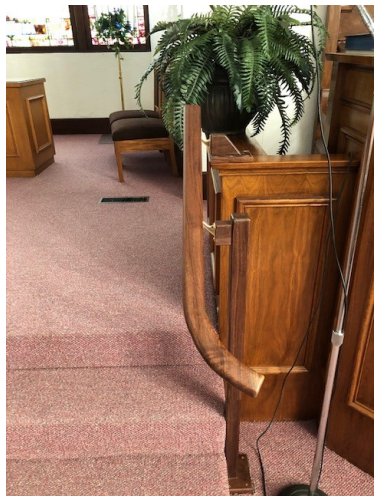
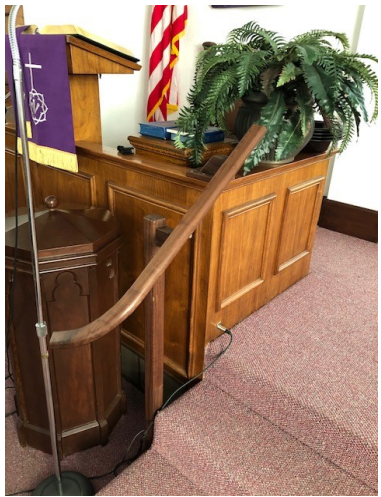
